A Centennial Celebration is a milestone occasion for a military unit of any patriotic persuasion, especially for an elite and distinguished organization. The Philippine Scouts rank amongst the highest echelons of military tradition for valor, heroism, supreme loyalty, and devotion to duty. Their hundred-year history originated with the Philippine War of Independence in 1901, when after the Spanish-American War, the Philippines and America ultimately solidified their eternal friendship and relationship.

In the early days of World War II, the Philippine Scouts distinguished themselves in the Philippine Defense Campaign against the Japanese onslaught, defending the island of Luzon, including Bataan and Corregidor. The Japanese timetable was disrupted, and a possible invasion

of Australia averted. Their heroic actions were a significant influence on the outcome of the Pacific war. The Scout's ordeals on the Bataan Death March, prison camps, slave labor, and hell ships are a testament to resolve, resourcefulness, determination, and survival. They are "modern day" examples of the adversities of Job in the Old Testament. For those who did not survive the ordeals, their valor and renown is further honored by their supreme sacrifice,

Thus it is "fitting and proper" that these hallowed deeds be appropriately commemorated, as shall be done on October 6, 2001, at The Presidio in San Francisco, CA. All veterans attending this significant event, especially those of World War II and Philippine Scouts are encouraged to wear appropriate ribbons or medals.

Having A Blast On Mount Pinatubo! Col. Nicoll F. Galbraith, Jr. Follows In His Father's Footsteps

December 1940 - Members of the 24th Field Artillery (PS) and the 26th Cavalry (PS), "true explorers with saddle hardy epidermis set forth upon a trusty charger into the wild unmapped regions," and Major Nicoll F. Galbraith dispatched a golf ball thereinto with a trusty #7 iron. Thus climaxed this training mission, and those participating were initiated into the "Ancient and Aromatic Order of Balugas of Pinatubo."

March 2001 - The not so hardy but with valiant spirit nonetheless, Nicoll F. Galbraith, Jr. (Public Relations Officer, Philippine Scouts Heritage Society) and friends Bob Reynolds, Bob Burt, and Fred Guyer, laboriously ascended to the top of Mount Pinatubo, from which about 900 feet was blasted away in the June 1991 eruption, and "expertly" plopped a golf ball into the beautiful lake, now the "top" of the mountain, with a trusty #7 iron. Note that Gatorade has replaced the whiskey bottle of 1940!

Posthumous Award Of The Purple Heart


Editor's note from Col. (ret.) Nicoll F. Galbraith, Jr.: The following article refers to the father of LtC Manuel Bulanon MC USAR (ret). LtC Bulanon was my comrade for many years in the 352 Combat Support Hospital, USAR.

2nd Lt. Ananias Bulanon (1891-1986) Company G, 57th Infantry (P.S.) (service years 1913-1948) represented the Philippine Scouts as a championship athlete of the Philippine Olympic Team, participating in the Far Eastern Games in 1923 and 1925. At the outset of the War, he was transferred to the "Sea Horse" Unit and was surrendered on Mindanao on 27 May 1942. He endured a subsequent "Death March," the rigors of Camp O'Donnell, and later was a distinguished "Guerilla" on Luzon. The posthumous Purple Heart was applied for by his son and was awarded on 5 October 1999.

This highly commendable action is available to other veterans, and may be initiated by family members, by obtaining the official certificate of service connected disability (or wounds) and submitted to:

The Purple Heart is a combat decoration awarded to members of the armed forces of the United States who are wounded by an instrument of war in the hands of the enemy and posthumously to the next of kin in the name of those who are killed in action or die of wounds received in action. It is the oldest military decoration in the world in present use and the first award made available to a common soldier. It was created by General George Washington.


Best Wishes to President Joe Aquino!





